Public Input Wanted as County Updates Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan

The Jackson County Emergency Management Office is working on updating the county's Multijurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP). The Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA 2000) requires that a plan be updated every five years to maintain eligibility for FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Assistance (HMA) grant programs. The plan covers Jackson County including the unincorporated areas, cities and school districts. The plan assesses the natural hazards that pose risk to the county, such as tornadoes, wind storms, ice storms, flooding and extreme temperatures and identifies ways to minimize the damage of future events. The plan will be updated by a planning team of representatives from county departments, local municipalities, school districts and other key stakeholders. As the county works to update the plan, it wants to hear from the public.

According to Lyn Medinger, Jackson County Emergency Management Coordinator, "Mitigation creates safer communities by reducing losses of life and property. Mitigation enables individuals and communities to recover more rapidly from disasters."

Examples of hazard mitigation actions include improvement of roads and culverts that experience repetitive flooding; construction of safe rooms at campgrounds, public parks, mobile home parks or schools to protect lives in the event of tornadoes or severe wind events; burying powerlines that may fail due to heavy snow, ice or wind storms; ensuring timely emergency communication to the public through warning sirens and mass notifications systems, and conducting public awareness and education campaigns to help people to be prepared to take safe action before, during or following a hazard event. Some mitigation activities may be eligible for FEMA Hazard Mitigation Assistance grant funding.

Jackson County is seeking feedback from residents and businesses to incorporate in the plan. To access the current HMP and the public survey visit the Jackson County Emergency Management website at https://jacksoncounty.iowa.gov/emergency-management/. Your input will help shape future hazard mitigation strategies. A draft of the updated plan will be posted for public review prior to submission to the State of Iowa.

Summary of Meeting:

The meeting began with an introduction of the hazard planning committee members and attendees. Lyn Medinger kicked off the meeting with introductions. Dawn Danielson, ECIA project facilitator, presented a power point presentation outlining the agenda for the meeting. Summary of Meeting:

The meeting began with an introduction of the hazard planning committee members and attendees. Lyn Medinger welcomed and thanked attendees. Dawn Danielson, ECIA project facilitator, presented a power point presentation outlining the agenda for the meeting. The presentation included an update of the planning timeline, hazard risk assessment survey results

and risk analysis assessments and updates. The HMPC discussed the Hazard Risk Assessment, the hazard assessment score for each hazard and survey results and determined which hazards the update would include. Danielson explained that the risk assessment will include review and update to the list of critical facilities for each jurisdiction. Danielson shared the 2023 National and State Hazard Mitigation Plan goals along with the prior Jackson County Hazard Mitigation Plan goals. The HMPC discussed the goals and decided to retain Goal 1 & 2 with no changes and to slightly modify Goal 3 to include verbiage regarding public awareness reaching the whole community whether urban or rural.

Danielson discussed the importance of mitigation and the importance of it in emergency management along with preparedness, response, and recovery. Prior mitigation actions were discussed, and jurisdictions received data collection worksheets to update the mitigation actions from the prior hazard mitigation plan. Tools to conduct the update were shared including the FEMA Mitigation Idea Book and the Local Mitigation Planning Handbook. Each jurisdiction was asked to collaborate with other members within its jurisdiction to update/modify the mitigation actions for its jurisdiction and return updated worksheets to Danielson by March 20, 2024.

The meeting was held in person at the Bellevue City Council Chambers located at 201 E Pleasant St, Maquoketa, IA 52060 and offered via zoom for those who were unable to attend in person. Representatives from each of the jurisdictions participated in the meeting. A total of 21 attendees participated in the meeting.
