SUBJECT: Fiscal Year 2026 Rural County Transportation Program Project Ranking

PURPOSE

To provide the Clinton County Engineer with a list of recommended Rural County Transportation Program projects for Fiscal Year 2026.

BACKGROUND

The Rural County Transportation Program (RCTP) helps small cities implement non-federal aid transportation projects. Clinton County awards RCTP funds to cities each fiscal year through a competitive application process. The Clinton County Board of Supervisors approved \$70,000 in local funds for the program in FY 2026. The maximum annual award amount provided to a city by the RCTP is \$25,000. All municipal governments established through State of Iowa statutes in Clinton County that do not receive a sub-allocation of funds from RPA 8 are eligible to apply for the RCTP.

DISCUSSION

Regional Planning Affiliation 8 (RPA 8) administers the RCTP application process and application ranking process. The Fiscal Year 2026 RCTP application window opened on January 30, 2025, and closed March 20, 2025. RPA 8 staff conducted workshops with mayors and city clerks on project eligibility and the application process. RPA 8 staff worked with cities to collect information, complete application forms, and compile supporting documentation. RPA 8 staff submitted completed applications to the ranking committee for their review.

RPA 8 staff received applications from three cities requesting a total of \$114,817. Table 1 provides the list of cities and project information. Staff reviewed the requests and found that all projects met the minimum eligibility requirements.

The RPA 8 Policy Board formed a subcommittee with representatives from Clinton, Delaware, Dubuque, and Jackson counties whose employers are not eligible to apply for RCTP funding. Table 2 lists the RCTP Ranking Committee members.

The RCTP ranking committee reviewed the applications and assigned points to each project based on the scoring criteria established in the program guidelines. Table 3 provides the results of the ranking process.

Based on the ranking results, the committee recommends awarding \$25,000 to the City of Andover, \$20,796 to the City of Camanche, \$19,021 to the City of Calamus and \$5,183 to the City of Low Moor.

CONCLUSION

RPA 8 is providing the Clinton County Engineer with the results of the RCTP application ranking process. RPA 8 staff will send award letters and draft funding agreements to grant recipients following approval from the Clinton County Engineer and Clinton County Board of Supervisors. If any city chooses to decline their recommended RCTP award, the funding will be offered to the next highest ranked applicant. RPA 8 staff recommends that any RCTP funds that remain unclaimed after being offered to all applicants should be added next year's RCTP funding pool. Thank you for your consideration.
