Review/Approve Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2023-2026 Transportation Alternative Program (TAP)

Ravada explained the total funds for the RPA 8 TAP project for FY 2023-2026 is \$813,000.00. Ravada stated we received the following project applications.

- 1- City of Clinton, 13th Avenue North Bike Trail
- 2- City of DeWitt, Paul Skeffington Memorial Trail Extension 2024 Westwood Drive
- 3- City of Manchester, Grand Avenue Trail Extension

Ravada stated Clinton and Manchester requested \$250,000.00 each, and the city of DeWitt requested \$170,000.00 to fund their projects. All applicants are requesting funds for different fiscal years. Ravada requested the boards approval so projects can be programmed into the TIP.

<u>Discussion on the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary grant program</u>

Ravada stated staff attending a few webinars with Federal Highway and US DOT on this subject. This is a new federal grant rolling out. Ravada stated first a safety plan needs to be in place for the RPA and MPO areas before applying for the grant. Ravada stated there will be \$1 billion dollars available yearly and it will be highly competitive. It was suggested to take a regional approach when applying. Ravada asked the board what their thoughts were on this grant.

Discussion followed.

Board decided they need more information on the grant and what it all involves. Board asked Ravada and staff to create a summary of all requirements of the grant and how it would look when RPA starts applying for funds.

Review/Adopt Clinton County Trail Plan

Fox stated this plan includes and inventory of bike and ped network within the RPA region and maps out future trails. Fox stated this project was funding through RPA work program and therefore will need to be adopted by RPA. Fox stated this plan has also been presented and approved by Clinton County supervisors and all cities within Clinton County.
