

Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A)

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) established a new Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary program that will provide grants over the next 5 years.

Overview

- Funding supports local initiatives to prevent death and serious injury on roads and streets, commonly referred to as “Vision Zero” or “Toward Zero Deaths” Initiatives.
- \$1 billion in annual funding, FY 2022-2026
- 40% for planning and 60% for Implementation
- 80% Federal | 20% Local Match. – In-kind contributions allowed

Timeline

- Notice of Funding Opportunity is Now Open
- Applications are due by 5:00 p.m. EDT on September 15, 2022

Who is eligible to apply?

- Metropolitan planning organizations;
- Counties, cities, towns, and other special districts that are subdivisions of a State;
- Federally recognized Tribal governments; and
- Partnerships comprised of the entities above.

What kind of activities are eligible?

- Develop or update a “Comprehensive Safety Action Plan” or Action Plan (e.g., Vision Zero plans).
- Conduct planning, design, and development activities in support of an Action Plan.
- Carry out projects and strategies identified in an Action Plan. - **Applicant must already have established Action Plan in place. Activities must be tied directly to projects and strategies identified in Action Plan.**

Grant Types

1. Action Plan
 - a. Develop or complete a comprehensive safety action plan.
 - b. Conduct supplemental action planning activities (in support of an existing comprehensive safety action plan)
2. Implementation
 - a. Implement projects and strategies
 - b. Conduct planning and design
 - c. Conduct supplemental action planning activities (in support of an existing comprehensive safety action plan)

What is happening locally?

- Existing local safety plans do not meet US DOT’s requirements for a comprehensive safety action plan.
- DMATS and RPA 8 boards are preparing to apply this September for grants to develop comprehensive safety action plans.
- Planning work would be divided between a private consultant and ECIA staff.
- If a SS4A planning grant is awarded in this round, the action plan could be completed in FY 2023 and area agencies could look to apply for project implementation funding in 2024.
