# Call to Order

# <u>Review/Approve City of Cascade's request for \$120,000 in Small City Surface</u> <u>Transportation Block Grant (STBG) funds for IA 136 improvements with IADOT</u>

Ravada referred the board to the enclosures and introduced Lisa Kotter from the City of Cascade.

Kotter addressed the board informing them of the project. Kotter stated the project is a complete reconstruction project of the south part of Highway 136 in Cascade. The cost is approximately \$2M, of which \$800K the City of Cascade is responsible. Kotter stated the letting will be in January and the project will begin in the spring. Kotter asked for consideration from the RPA boards for this project.

Ravada stated the small city account has a balance of \$127K.

Discussion followed.

Kinney asked about the application process the RPA has set in place and asked why we have gotten away from this process.

Ravada stated that recently projects have been so few and far between, so staff are looking to revamp that process at a later date.

Discussion followed.

# **Review/Approve City of Grand Mound's request for a scope change to extend East** <u>Street's improvements from the Union Pacific RR south to the intersection with</u> <u>Sunnyside Street without additional STBG funds</u>

Ravada stated the City of Grand Mound received \$250K from the RPA, although their amount for the project came in lower than what the city requested. The City of Grand Mound is requesting to expand the scope of the project so they can utilize the remaining funds on the project, instead of returning the fund back to the RPA. Ravada stated this type of change has been approved in the past.

Allendar informed the board the scope change will help the City of Grand Mound with phase II of the project, which would typically take the city 5-10 years before having enough local funds to move forward with phase II. Allendar stated phase II is updates for pavement and overlay improvements, ADA and utilities adjustments, no sewer and water.

Discussion followed.

#### **Discussion on Urban Area Boundary Adjustment**

Shea stated every 10 years the federal government does a census and following that census each states local officials or designee is responsible to update the Urban Area boundaries to meet Federal-Aid highway program requirements consistent with State and local planning. Shea suggested the RPA forms a small committee, possibly the tech committee to discuss the current boundaries and look at adjusting them, if necessary. Shea stated this needs to be completed by September.

### **Update on Bike and Pedestrian Plan**

Fox presented the bike and pedestrian plan to the board. Fox stated the purpose is to develop a plan to expand and improve the bicycle and pedestrian network as part of the regional transportation system. During this update staff reviewed related plans and federal policies, reviewed existing conditions, facilities, common challenges, lack of safety options and crash potentials at sites. Staff also gathered stakeholder and community feedback, developed a future network plan and implemented the plan. Fox also introduced an interactive project map that the community and view to see existing and future bike and ped facilities.
